AVANT LES RUES BY CHLOÉ LERICHE: CLOSING FILM OF THE 34th RENDEZ-VOUS DU CINÉMA QUÉBÉCOIS



MONTREAL, Thursday, January 7, 2016 – Québec Cinéma is pleased to announce that *Avant les rues*, the first fictional feature by director-producer Chloé Leriche, will close the 34th annual **Rendez-vous du cinéma québécois**, to be held this February 18 to 27. Produced by Les Films de l'autre and distributed by FunFilm, the film will be premiered at a SOIRÉE TAPIS BLEU on February 27, presented by Bell in collaboration with the Casino de Montréal.

Shawnook lives in a small Atikamekw community in Quebec with his mother, cop stepfather, sister and niece. One day, a white drifter hires him as a backroads guide, to search for a cottage to rob. The evening goes very badly: Shawnouk kills a man. After fleeing into the forest, he returns to his community and tries to liberate himself through traditional rituals. Avant les rues was filmed on location in an Atikamekw village, with many local non-professional actors working in their native language. Alongside actor Martin Dubreuil, the audience will discover the talented Rykko Bellemare and the charismatic, poignant Jacques Newashish, Kwena Boivin Bellemare and Janis Ottawa.

Chloé Leriche writes, directs and edits her fictional films and art videos. Her work has been screened and appreciated at several festivals in Canada and abroad, and shown on television and in museums. Having made several well-received short films such as *Les grands* and *Soleils bleus*, Leriche has made a feature debut as poetic as it is harsh, taking a frank look at real life in aboriginal communities. The filmmaker has often worked in collaboration with the Wapikoni, the mobile training and production unit run by and for young First Nations artists. She also worked with numerous residents of Quebec's three Atikamekw communities and produced the film in partnership with the Manawan Atikamekw council.

"It is a great pleasure to close the Rendez-vous by introducing audiences to Chloé Leriche's first feature, Avant les rues, a deeply sensitive and humane film that goes straight to the heart. Rarely has our cinema taken such an honest, lucid look at our First Nations fellow citizens. Avant les rues is one the festival team's favourite films of the year, and we have no doubt that everyone who has the pleasure of seeing it – and I

hope many people will – at the festival or in general release will appreciate is as much as we do," said Dominique Dugas, director of the Rendez-vous du cinéma québécois.
