# 7th ANNUAL RENDEZ-VOUS PRO

# PROGRAMMING IN TUNE WITH THE FILM INDUSTRY'S ISSUES

**Montreal**, **February 13**, **2019** – Rendez-vous Pro invites Quebec's film professionals to ponder and discuss the industry's big issues during its 7<sup>th</sup> annual edition, from **February 27 to March 1**. With a sharp focus on current concerns in the industry, the event promises to be more diverse and inspiring than ever.

"Rendez-vous Pro is picking up where it left off last year, offering privileged access to industry specialists and fostering reflection, inspiration and discussions among professionals. We are committed to hosting a wide range of workshops, presentations and networking activities designed to support advancement for the industry and its creators, including early-career professionals and more seasoned filmmakers," said Jasmine Caron, programming director for Rendez-vous Pro and the Rendez-vous Québec Cinéma.

This year, the event will highlight the expertise of professionals who will come from Canada and around the world to present the main elements of their work, as well as their innovative creative practices and exhibition initiatives. For three days, high-profile guests will participate in a series of one-on-one discussions, lectures and workshops touching on everything from participants' professional development to creative thinking and approaches to supporting local talent.

"Our industry is highly diverse, with an exceptional array of talents. And that fact is what guided me as I developed the program and selected our guests this year. More than ever, Rendez-vous Pro will be a chance to reflect, meet people, ask questions and celebrate our expertise," said Frédérick Pelletier, the event's programmer.

The seventh annual Rendez-vous Pro, presented in collaboration with the National Bank, will take place from February 27 to March 1, 2019, at the BAnQ Vieux-Montréal, the Centre Pierre-Péladeau, the Cinémathèque québécoise and Studio MELS. More than 20 international guests, from 12 countries, will join Quebec's industry professionals in discussing their vision for the industry and making valuable contacts.

The third annual **[WEB]SÉRIES SESSIONS**, presented by the FIP, will invite webseries producers to a networking lunch on Friday, March 1, with international and Canadian platforms and programmers.

The **FRANCO-CANADIAN COCKTAIL**, organized in collaboration with the Front des Réalisateurs Indépendants du Canada (FRIC), will close this year's Rendez-vous Pro. With a focus on francophone culture, the event will bring together Canadian francophone industry professionals from outside Quebec, professionals from Quebec, international guests and representatives of public and para-public institutions.

Now a fixture at Rendez-vous Pro, the **GRAND FLIRT** returns for a fifth year in the same tried and true format, with short meetings where directors pitch new film projects to producers.

In the **ÉCRANS DU QUÉBEC** activity, Rendez-vous Pro gives programmers and buyers exclusive sneak previews of the upcoming year's fictional and documentary films. The films run the gamut from the latest by Quebec's most famous filmmakers and innovative works by our most promising new talents. Écrans du Québec showcases the richness and diversity of our cinema, and each year it generates significant new opportunities for our films.
