34th annual Rendez-vous du cinéma québécois OPENING FILM: BORIS SANS BÉATRICE by DENIS CÔTÉ



Montreal, December 16, 2015 – **Québec Cinéma** is pleased to announce that the North American premiere of **Boris sans Béatrice** by Denis Côté will open the **34**th **annual Rendez-vous du cinéma québécois** in Montreal on February 18. The screening of the latest film by Côté, an entry in the official competition at the 66th Berlin Film Festival, will be presented at Cinéma Impérial and will launch the SOIRÉES TAPIS BLEU series at the Rendez-vous du cinéma québécois, presented by Bell.

"Denis Côté is now one of the most acclaimed of Quebec's filmmakers on the international circuit, and it was the RVCQ that showed his earliest films, nearly 20 years ago. There is a long and loyal relationship between him and our festival, and we are very proud to open our 34th edition with **Boris sans Béatrice**. His latest film once again confirms that Côté is one of the most original voices not only in Quebec cinema, but worldwide. This time, he immerses us in another unique world, far from the usual locations of cinematic realism, making *Boris sans Béatrice* a powerful, almost Shakespearean film, led by James Hyndman who finds, in Boris Malinovsky, a role fit for his immense talent," said Dominique Dugas, director of the Rendez-vous du cinéma québécois.

Starring James Hyndman, Simone-Élise Girard, Denis Lavant, Isolda Dychauk, Dounia Sichov, Laetitia Isambert-Denis and Louise Laprade, **Boris sans Béatrice** tells the story of Boris Malinovsky (James Hyndman), a strong, proud man who is rather arrogant about his success. Boris seems to have achieved every goal he ever had. For some time, his wife Béatrice (Simone-Élise Girard), a federal cabinet minister, has been bedridden with a mysterious illness. To escape the misery, Boris has an affair with a colleague, Helga (Dounia Sichov), and grows closer to his young housekeeper, Klara (Isolda Dychauk). The sudden appearance of a stranger (Denis Lavant) forces Boris to face the world, his assumptions and his certainties.

In the 1990s Denis Côté founded nihilproductions and made 15 short films. He worked as a journalist and film

critic before making his first feature, *Les états nordiques*, in 2005. His next film was *Nos vies privées* in 2007. *Curling*, his fifth feature, won major awards at the Locarno Film festival and was screened at more than 70 festivals. His films have been shown at dozens of film events. *Vic+Flo ont vu un ours* won the Alfred Bauer award at the 2013 Berlin Film Festival. *Boris sans Béatrice* is his tenth film.

Boris sans Béatrice, produced by Sylvain Corbeil and Nancy Grant and Metafilms and distributed par K-Films, is scheduled for theatrical release on March 4, 2016.
